## Graduate Colloquium

CLIHC 2017 is the bi-annual conference that aims to bring together the Latin American HCI community. The graduate colloquium focuses on graduate students (master's and doctoral students) working in Human-Computer Interaction (HCI) related fields. The objective is to provide feedback to students on their current research, guidance on their future research, and receive a fresh perspective from researchers outside their institution. Feedback will be provided by prominent researchers in HCI. The graduate colloquium will take place during the CLIHC 2017.

### Aims of the graduate colloquium

- Offer students the opportunity to share and discuss their work before experienced researchers.
- Promote collaboration among graduate students across different universities in Latin America.
- Let the community learn about research projects being developed by graduate students

### Overview of Graduate Colloquium

Each student will submit a proposal. Accepted students will give a talk to a panel of researchers. The duration of the talk will be 15 minutes and after that, there will be a 5-minute Q&A session for panel members to provide constructive feedback. Finally, another 5 minutes will be allocated to questions from the audience.

### Submissions

Submissions (up to 4 pages) must be written in English using the SIGCHI Extended Abstract format (<https://fce.ufm.edu/clihc2017/#CLIHCSubmission>). Submission must include the following sections: Introduction, Related Work, Research Question or Thesis Statement, Methodology, Status of Research, and Expected results. The methodology section, must include a *brief* completion timeline for each proposed research stage. The status of research section must include: state of research (e.g., what you have done and what you have left to do), and where you are in your academic career (e.g., second year doctoral student, first year masters' student, research proposal stage, candidacy stage, all but dissertation).
